New Local Planning Policy removal of occupancy restrictions

City of Nedlands landowners can now apply to remove notifications that restrict occupancy for Over 55's Accommodation and Ancillary Dwellings, from land titles. Notification removal involves submitting a Development Application to the City.

The new Local Planning Policy – Occupancy Restrictions, is now available via the City's website. Copies can also be viewed at the City's Administration Office and the Nedlands Library.

- Bishop Road Reserve: extending asphalt foreshore accessway to new concrete footpath and irrigation upgrade.
- David Cruickshank Reserve: new turf irrigation station for Jutland Parade, garden kerbing and nature path in the eco-zone.
- Allen Park: upgrading bore pump and headworks.
- Peace Memorial Rose Gardens: upgrading groundwater borehole, pump and headworks.
- Charles Court Reserve: replacing and upgrading decorative fencing around skate park.
- Point Resolution Reserve: upgrading drink fountain.
- Footpath rehabilitation in Bruce Street.
