Mayor's Message

Dear Residents,

What an amazing start to 2023; the weather has been warm but not stifling allowing for walks in our beautiful City.

What makes our City so striking is the established tree canopy cover, it makes Nedlands an enviable place to live. Tree cover is not only beautiful but practical, it reduces our energy costs with natural shade keeping homes cool rather than using air conditioning plus trees combat climate change. Trees absorb carbon dioxide in the atmosphere, so planting a tree is one of the simplest things you can do to tackle climate change.

We are committed to increasing our tree canopy cover with the City of Nedlands Urban Forest Strategy. This strategy outlines 3 key target areas; street planting, bushland conservation and private land.

In the current financial year, we will plant 565 trees (25 litres or larger) on nature strips and in public areas. Our bushland conservation team planted 3,270 trees in 2022 across our bush reserves, an initiative that has greatly assisted in the regeneration of the Hollywood Bush Reserve after it was severely affected by fire this time last year.

Finally Scheme Amendment 12, this potential change will offer some protection for trees on private land. On some properties, significant trees will require a development application in order to be removed. The public consultation period closed in December last year and the results will be announced at Council in February. From here we will take it to the Western Australian Planning Commission (WAPC) for approval. Although this amendment is a first for West Australian Local Governments it's already in place across many interstate and overseas jurisdictions.

I would like for Nedlands to be a leader in tree canopy conservation to ensure our walks stay cool in summer and our energy bills stay low thanks to Mother Nature's shade.


Volunteers
