RANGER SERVICES

NO STOPPING AREAS

No Stopping areas are areas in which vehicles may not stop for any amount of time. This is generally for safety and access reasons. These areas can be indicated by signs and/or solid yellow lines adjacent to the kerb or road edge.

PRIVATE PROPERTY

Vehicles should not be parked on land that is not a road or parking station without the consent of the owner / occupier of the land.

VERGE PARKING

Vehicles should not be parked on street verges without the permission of the owner / occupier of the premises adjacent to that street verge.

Vehicles should not be parked on street verges where signage prohibits such action.

FREE PARKING (Time Limited)

Free parking, which is time limited, is available in most streets.

Drivers must pay attention to the signage indicating the restriction periods and time limits in each location.



Parking for longer than the time allowed may result in an infringement being issued.

If you are moving or re-parking your vehicles you must not park in the same street, within 2 hours of leaving as time is accrued no matter where you are positioned along the street.

AVOID AN INFRINGEMENT

To avoid an infringement, never:

- Stop in a 'No Stopping' area,
- Park in a 'No Parking' area,
- Park in a 'Loading Zone',
- Park in a Bus Stop,
- Park in a disabled (ACROD) bay without a permit,
- Park on a verge where signage prohibits such action,
- Park on a verge without permission from property owner or occupier,
- Park in bays designated for other types of vehicles (e.g. taxi or motorcycle)
- Park in right of way or obstruct private driveways,
- Obstruct footpath access,
- Park facing against the traffic flow (headed in the wrong direction),
- Remove chalk marks on tyres,
- Move the vehicle (once parked) and re-park within the same street within 2 hours.

TRAVELSMART

Did you know that half of all car trips in Perth are less than 5km? This distance can easily be cycled by most people within 20 minutes.

Walking 1km can easily be done by most people within 10 minutes.

City of Nedlands is also serviced by an extensive and frequent public transport system including bus routes and the Fremantle train line.

So try challenging yourself to walk, cycle or catch public transport for your next trip around the City of Nedlands and avoid unwanted parking infringements, whilst also:

- Benefiting your health,
- Protecting the environment,
- Reducing congestion on local streets,
- Creating safer communities, and
- Saving money on travel costs.

Try cycling, walking, catching public transport, or car pooling to the shops, school, university, café and post box in your local area.
