# The Books on Wheels Service

Are you, or do you know, someone who loves books, movies or magazines but can't make it to the library?

Our Books on Wheels service delivers up to 12 items each fortnight, to City of Nedlands residents who are unable to visit the library because of limited mobility, chronic illness, or due to a physical disability. These items can include books, audiobooks, DVDs and magazines.

Library items are selected and delivered by a team of dedicated volunteers, based on your reading and viewing preferences.

## How the service works

#### What the library will do for you:

- Provide you with a selection of library items according to your reading preferences. These preferences will be discussed at an initial interview with the Books on Wheels Officer.
- Deliver up to 12 items each fortnight. These items can include regular and large print books, audiobooks in CD and MP3 formats, DVDs and magazines.
- Deliver your library items in a library bag with an identifying tag to make it easy to store and find your library books.
- Include you in our Library Update email mailing list, if desired. This Library Update email mailing list notifies you of any upcoming library programs, events and newsletters.





### What we ask of users:

- Take responsibility of your library items. Keep them in the library bag provided, so that they are easy to identify and find.
- Return your books in the library bag to the volunteer each fortnight. If you are not home, place them in a secure and covered location for the volunteers to collect on your delivery day.
  Volunteers will not leave a new delivery without picking up the previous fortnight's items.
- Notify us of any changes that may affect the service, such as illness or vacation. We can then temporarily suspend delivery, if necessary.
- Speak with the volunteers, or the Books on Wheels Officer, about items you would like to keep a little longer. Or, any other requests you might have.
