Point Resolution riverbank recovery

In partnership with the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions, the City has completed a river foreshore restoration project including the planting of 6,000 dryland and foreshore local provenance seedlings, protection of existing vegetation and removing invasive weeds.

The Department's grant of \$22,662 has enabled the City to increase biodiversity, improve habitat and protect the foreshore from tidal and storm surges.

Upgrades coming to Brockway Road

The main connecting road between Floreat, Mt Claremont and Nedlands is set for a major upgrade during March and April.

Stage 1 is a joint project with the WA Department of Transport to construct a shared pathway for bicycles and pedestrians, commencing on 16 March, followed by progressive road resurfacing from 22 March to 28 April.

During this time there will be nightworks where possible as well as detours and road closures to ensure safety for all road users.

Planning and Development: big changes for small projects

A number of amendments to the Planning and Development (Local Planning schemes) Regulations 2015 have now come into effect.

Business owners no longer need planning approval for a range of small projects and 'change of use' proposals. Similarly, changes also affect uses that are relevant and suited to town centres, commercial areas and mixed use areas such as cafes, restaurants, shops, small bars and consulting rooms.

This is designed to streamline approvals, making it easier for people to do small improvements to homes and businesses.
