Tree canopy - Nedlands has it covered

Researchers from UWA, RMIT and CSIRO have discovered a credible method of predicting tree canopies of the future.

The study undertaken in 2020, was seeking a predictive model for canopy cover on residential lots (excluding street trees and public open spaces), and specifically investigated the City of Nedlands in assessing its findings.

Using Nedlands' current canopy, the study predicted an increase of over three per cent (or four hectares) of canopy cover between 2009 and 2050 under the current Local Planning Scheme (LPS3).

Ensuring a strong, sustainable tree canopy is one of the City's highest priorities. In the past financial year, 753 trees have been planted on verges, parks and reserves including free street trees requested by residents.

In addition, the City's participation in a longitudinal tree canopy study currently underway, is also ensuring the City can monitor and respond to tree canopy changes for the future. Read more on **nedlands.wa.gov.au**.
