Brockway set for major upgrades including new shared pathway Stage 1 begins 16 March 2021 – Stage 2 begins 22 March 2021

The City of Nedlands is pleased to announce the commencement of two significant capital works projects on Brockway Road Mt Claremont; the much-anticipated joint dual pathway project which will ultimately link Floreat, Mt Claremont, Nedlands and beyond for cyclists and pedestrians and the road upgrade and rehabilitation of Brockway Road.

Stage 1:

16 March to 19 April 2021:

Construction of a 1015m long, 2.5m wide dual use path within the south-bound verge on Brockway Road. A 40kph speed limit will be in place during this time.

This is a joint project with the WA Department of Transport (DoT) to construct a shared pathway for people riding bikes or walking. Once complete, the shared pathway will improve connectivity to nearby Karrakatta and Loch Street train stations as well as a number of local schools and sporting and recreational facilities. The DoT's Your Move team is encouraging locals to consider how best to take advantage of this new, safe and convenient way to ride or walk around their neighbourhood.

Your Move is a free program that provides information and support to help the community find more active, healthy ways to get around the metropolitan area. The team works with individuals, schools and workplaces to find ways to spend less time in the car and more time outdoors.

Stage 2:

Progressive road resurfacing of Brockway Road to be carried out from 22 March to 28 April.

22 March to 2 April 2021 – Lemnos Street to Quintilian Road:

- Brockway Road will be temporarily reduced to a single lane one-way road. Signed detours will be in place to redirect traffic via Lemnos Street.

23 March 2021 – Lemnos Street to John XXIII:

- The south-bound lane will be closed to enable night works to be undertaken to resurface the asphalt.

25 March 2021 – Lemnos Street to John XXIII:

- The north-bound lane will be closed to enable night works to be undertaken to resurface the asphalt.

6 April 2021 to 28 April – Quintilian Road to Alfred Road

- Brockway Road will be closed during the Easter school holidays. Signed detour route via Lemnos will be in place.
