Partial closure for Quintilian Road proposed

Changes are proposed for Quintilian Road in Mt Claremont – and the City of Nedlands wants to hear your thoughts.

It comes after speed plateaus were installed in early 2018, following community concerns about the volume and speed of traffic using the road as a shortcut between Brockway Road and Stubbs Terrace.

“The speed plateaus have resulted in a substantial decrease in speed, marginal decrease in traffic and increase in the number of commercial vehicles,” City of Nedlands Acting CEO Martyn Glover said.

“But community concerns remain over the volume of traffic, specifically the high level of commercial traffic using Quintilian Road.”


Mr Glover said the options available to reduce commercial vehicle were limited to a full or partial closure of Quintilian Road.

“In light of this, the City’s preference is for a partial road closure at the Brockway end of Quintilian Road,” he said.

“This partial closure would deny access into Quintilian from Brockway Road and Camelia Avenue and support the safer anti-clockwise rotation of school traffic for pick-up and drop-off.

“We want to ensure people who live on or near the road, work or go to school in the area or simply use Quintilian Road to travel from place to place have an opportunity to have their say.”
