COVID-19 Update : City of Nedlands lifts COVID restrictions

The Nedlands Library and the City's Administration Office have already reopened with both services now implementing COVID-19 precautions to allow visitors to access library services and the customer service counter.

In response to the further easing of restrictions in Phase 3 of the State Government's COVID-19 guidelines, the City is now reopening a broader range of services and facilities.

From Saturday, 6 June 2020:

- All outdoor gym equipment, water fountains, BBQs and children's playgrounds will be re-opened.
- The skate park and bike pump trail will be reopened.
- Many halls and venues will be reopening – for the full list please visit nedlands.wa.gov.au
- All public toilets will be open for use.

Drabble House is now open for bookings. Venues now cater for a maximum of 100 people, or 300 if rooms can be segregated, with a limit of two square metres per person

Tresillian Art Centre

Tresillian will open to the public on 22 June 2020. This is the beginning of re-enrolment week, when all Term 1 students will have first option to book in for Term 3 courses. Bookings for the school holiday program will also be open. These bookings can be made online at tresillianartscentre.wa.gov.au or in person.

Key dates are:

- 29 June: Open enrolments for new students. Bookings online at tresillianartscentre.wa.gov.au or in person.
- 6 – 17 July: Tresillian School Holiday program for ages 5 -17 years, art and craft classes in various mediums.
- 27 July – 18 September: Term 3 runs with Language, Art, Craft, Ceramics, Yoga, Pilates and After School children's classes. The Café will also open on 27 July.

Mt Claremont Library remains closed to allow further cleaning and maintenance work to take place.
