## **Park yourself in: have your say on what the reserve deserves**

Want to know more about what's proposed for David Cruickshank Reserve?

The City of Nedlands is holding four information sessions on the draft enviro-scape plan from 4pm to 6pm, Thursday 27 April, at the Adam Armstrong Pavilion in Dalkeith.

City of Nedlands Mayor Max Hipkins said the aim was to develop a strategic vision for the park's future use and development, aligned to current service levels and budgets.

"Issues we'll be considering include the natural and built environment, water quality and conservation and climate change, along with accessibility, community use and ensuring the precinct is fit for purpose," he said.

"The project aims to ensure community needs are met in the most economical way possible, across the reserve's entire lifespan.

"Initiatives relate to park users and accessibility, water conservation, landscaping and vegetation, furniture, shade provision, parking, infrastructure and outdoor recreational activities."

The final vision will be presented as a concept plan, featuring a range of initiatives to ensure regular parks users and residents are provided for now and into the future.

Mayor Hipkins said the information session was about encouraging good participation and communication with the local community.

"This allows pertinent issues to be discussed which, in turn, assists the council in its decisions about how best to proceed," he said.

"We want to make sure the community gets adequate opportunity to make its point-of-view known after being presented with all the relevant information."
